





















LOGLINE

Pauline Parry, a divorced mother of two, struggles to make a name for herself as she works to become a chef and learn about the restaurant business while finding love.

SYNOPSIS

In the late 70s, society told women in the UK to stay home, be homemakers, or secretaries, with little or no pay. PAULINE PARRY (27), a divorcée and mother of two children, JOANNE (4) and ROSS (3) had a life decision to make; be one of those women who stayed home and cared for her children or do something special with her life. The choice wasn't easy, but Pauline believed in herself and had a dream of being a successful chef/restauranteur and coming to America.

In Somerset, England, opportunities were even more sparse for women who wanted more out of life. When opportunity came knocking, Pauline took full advantage of it. But it didn't come without risks, sacrifice, hard work, and tears.

Blostin's, a quaint little French bistro in the English countryside, would be the beginning of her culinary journey. BILL (40s), the chef and owner with his wife MONICA (40s), would give Pauline's passion for food inspiration and motivation. They offered her a job and the tiny apartment above the bistro to live with her children.

Blostin's would become the awakening and blessing Pauline needed. Bill would introduce Pauline to French culinary and show her around a commercial kitchen. Monica would teach Pauline about wines, the restaurant business, and dealing with customers. At the end of a long evening, she would go upstairs and tuck her children into bed for school the next day. It became a routine for Pauline as she would learn something new every day, whether it was a recipe for a great dish such as Coq au Vin, Rosemary Lamb Shanks, or having to make a business decision for the bistro. Her ex-husband DAVID (28), certainly didn't make things easy. He didn't approve that they lived above a restaurant, and he resented the fact that Pauline was moving on and doing well. He had no say in anything since Pauline caught him cheating with a younger woman. This event was soon to become a blessing. Pauline and David learn to work things out for the benefit of the children as her job and life become more demanding until David has to make a decision once more that will affect all their lives.

In the midst of Blostin's, love will also find a way into Pauline's heart. Although, that, too, did not come easy. After a few first dates, DENNIS (late 20s) comes into her life. A handsome craftsman, he was a regular at Blostin's, but a player who brought many dates in for dinner. Pauline, however, would leave an indelible mark on Dennis's heart from their first meeting. And just like Pauline's blossoming culinary career, Dennis was just as unpredictable.

Pauline's time, commitment, and effort are about to get rewarded as KENNETH BELL (50s) offers her a position to be an Assistant Manager at Thornbury Castle. The job and location would certainly be a step up from the bistro, and Pauline knew she had to take it, even if it meant leaving everything she built with Bill and Monica at Blostin's. Pauline would take all the knowledge and experience she had learned along with her kids and move onto the castle grounds. The job, of course, is a more significant challenge and would come with greater responsibilities that she and her kids would have to adjust to.

As Pauline's and Dennis's relationship blossoms, she finally introduces him to Joanne and Ross after a few years of dating. Dennis will do anything to gain the kids' approval. Trips to London together lead to talking about their life together, but Pauline is not ready. She rejects Dennis's proposal for them to move in with him. She is focused on her career as she does not want to depend on another man again, even if it is Dennis. But both realize there's much work in their careers left before they can seriously discuss living together. This will lead Dennis to accept a once-in-a-lifetime job on the other side of the world in Malibu, California, to build an English-style windmill. The first true test for both Pauline and Dennis, as they will be apart for months.

Pauline focuses on her work, not knowing what will happen between her and Dennis. Her new boss, Kenneth Bell, is much harder on her than Bill and Monica ever were at Blostin's. Her job is more challenging now on a bigger scale as Thornbury Castle is busier and a more recognized establishment. The position also tests her desire and commitment to her passion for food. Pauline is pushed to her limits at Thornbury Castle and begins to question everything.


Pauline and Dennis write letters to each other every day and talk once a week. It's not enough for both of them, especially for Dennis. He proposes that Pauline and the kids come to California and move there with him. Pauline has been in the English countryside all her life, so going to California, much less living there, might as well be a dream. Dennis buys Pauline a ticket to Malibu to see everything California has to offer. It will also be a good break for Pauline from the everyday stress of Thornbury Castle, and Kenneth Bell knew she needed a break. But even going to California to see Dennis did not come easy. Her flight to Los Angeles got canceled, so Pauline jumped on a flight to San Francisco instead, not realizing how far it was from Los Angeles. Dennis was there waiting for her. As they make their way south through Napa on the Pacific Coast Highway, Pauline begins to see a life for her and her kids along with Dennis. After a few weeks together in California, their minds are made up about the move, but not before Dennis proposes to Pauline for the third time. This time Pauline accepts.

Pauline is excited and nervous to get back home and tell her family that she's engaged to Dennis. She's afraid to tell them that they've also decided to move to California. Pauline also knows she must get full custody of Joanne and Ross to make California a reality, which will require her ex-husband David to agree or be forced to by the legal system. David wasn't about to give up his kids that easily.

Dennis's family disapproved of him marrying Pauline. They didn't like that Pauline was a divorcée with two kids. But Dennis didn't care what his family thought or if his family would come to their wedding or not. It mattered to Pauline and bothered her that Dennis's parents disapproved of her, and they didn't even get a chance to get to know her yet.

Nevertheless, Pauline and Dennis are married without his parent's blessing and David's decision of the kids' futures hovering above them. It wasn't until weeks later that Pauline will finally get the approval from Dennis's parents she so badly wanted. The judge also grants Pauline full custody of Joanne and Ross so they can move to California. Pauline doesn't want to take the children from David's life entirely, so it was decided that they would spend six to eight weeks every summer with him. Pauline also got Kenneth Bell's blessing and recommendation to continue to do the work she's so passionate about in California. So ultimately, in the end, love and goodwill prevail.

Pauline's culinary story reads like a recipe. Each ingredient makes up a different part of her life, with each step signifying moments and decisions made. Ultimately, the food that Pauline makes becomes part of what defines her, interwoven in her life story. It's all part of a great recipe that makes her story a one-of-a-kind recipe.




